Well now is the time to put that into action. Make that pizza from the English muffin or better yet from scratch. I know this isn't for everyone but it's time away from the tv or gaming.

My Mom was an excellent cook and wonderful teacher in ways of the kitchen. So as a newlywed I tried to carry on the tradition. I made all meals from scratch, canned, froze and maintained a good size garden. I even made my own bread. Of course, things changed over the years but now that we're home more and the kids are around try to recapture the good old days. Found several recipes to have fun with so try them.

Have dinner all set for tonight and wanted to add that special something, something. Try this and no laughing!

Easy no yeast dinner rolls

375 oven, bake 18-20, 1 dozen, child friendly

Now the decision: using a large bowl or better yet a gallon size zip lock bag put in the following:

- 1 cup flour
- 1 ½ tsp baking powder
- ½ tsp salt
- ½ cup milk
- 2 T. mayo

Mix well until all ingredients are combined. Spoon into greased muffin tin. Here's where the baggie comes into play. Just snip off a corner and squeeze into the muffin tin. Easy no mess. Fill muffin cups halfway and bake. Throw away the baggie and the mess is gone --- no dishes.... Don't you think the kids would love this? I know I would.

Can't go out to eat and take out just not the same unless its pizza and wings. WELL, try one of the following condiment hacks. It's not the same but might satisfy that craving.

Chick-fil-a Sauce

Whisk together $\frac{1}{2}$ c mayo, 2 tsp. prepared mustard, 1 tsp lemon juice, 2T. honey, 1 T BBQ sauce. Use as dip for chicken nuggets or sauce for sandwich.

Blooming Onion Sauce

Mix together 1/3 c mayo, 2 T sour cream, 2 T horseradish, 1 T ketchup, $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp paprika and garlic salt. Cover and refrigerate at least an hour before use.

Texas Roadhouse Butter

Whip together 2 sticks butter, softened to room temp., $\frac{3}{4}$ c powdered sugar, $\frac{3}{4}$ c honey, 2 tsp cinnamon. Put in airtight container and refrigerate. Use on sweet potatoes or rolls.

Hacks:

- Cornstarch will remove all kinds of knots. Rub some in shoelaces, chains, string...try it!
- Toothpaste removes ink from clothes. Apply to stain, let dry then wash.
- Cottage cheese and sour cream will last twice as long if you turn the containers upside down.
- Throw a dry towel into the dryer and it will cut the time in half.
- If a shirt shrinks, put it in bowl of ice water with 1 c hair conditioner. Leave for an hour. The size will be restored.
- You can add 2 eggs and $\frac{1}{2}$ c oil to any cake mix and make it into a cookie dough.
- Forgot to grease cake pan? When it comes from the oven set on damp towel for few minutes. Then turn out of pan.
