# Pastor's Report

#### A Letter for Christmas 2020

Dear Church,

This season is one where our strongest traditions lie, as a nation and at least in the modern practice of Christianity. I wish to know so much more from you historians, amateur and formal, about what years past have been in Pine Plains and as this church. Without full knowledge, I know you young ones don't remember 1918, so I feel confident that in March, this indeed became a year like no other. So here, in this season, there will be quite a juxtaposition. The grief of the changed times that included Easter, summer festivals, harvest time events, travel delayed, time away from loved ones, and the many days concerned for health and experiencing death will surely linger. If it has not already, my hope is that while we know the losses and the hardship of 2020, that the marking of the birth of Jesus the Christ will bring joy! It has every reason to make us feel joy, and Christmas joy will have a welcome place of urgent need this year. By the time you read this, we have been together (some in the sanctuary, some via the internet) for one of four Advent Sundays. We'll mark Twelfth Night, January 5th (put on your calendar a hold for a Zoom event 7pm on January 4th) and Epiphany in Sunday worship Jan. 9th (the actual day is always Jan. 6).

#### My prayers include:

that we will have a fullest time of Advent preparations;

so that in readiness joy will come when the news of Christmas arrives anew, unto us a child is born who will lead us and heal the world;

that good traditions will be brilliant even with the changes brought by this year's virus;

that you will have nourishment that warms;

that you will write, make phone calls, and video calls that stretch to include those who might not make the list in a "normal" year;

that any loneliness that is amongst you, you will reach out and be well received. You are most welcome to begin with me. God loves you and I love you;

that travels will be safe;

that we all keep the good health we have and improve on it, and the many amongst us who need healing of all kinds will find it swiftly and fully;

that we worship God well and often, praying and seeking.

A good Advent, then a merry Christmas, then a very good 2021, I pray for each of you. Be in good touch.

# Session Update

Our Session work since the last, published update includes:

- Adopted a Conflict of Interest policy for Session votes, not because there was any actual or predicted need, but as a best practice
- Discussed 2021 church budget, with final vote expected December 21st
- Changed Sexton to hourly (\$15 per) position which is expected to increase his annual compensation
- Made a slight increase of Secretary hourly pay to \$15/hour
- Paid a one-time bonus of \$150 each to Sexton and Secretary as a small recognition of the excellence of their service and the changes brought by COVID these recent months
- Explored a plan for auditing of church finances as required
- Adopted a plan to offer church as a meeting space to potential first-time users from the community
- Reviewed COVID safety plan for building use with no present changes
- Discussed energy conservation and property needs when building is unoccupied

Pastor Ryan moderates the Session and is glad to go more in-depth on the work of your elected leaders past and future. Minutes of the Session meeting are available for review upon request.

The Food Locker took our left-over bread from the turkey dinner. We gave Willow Roots 2 frozen turkeys that had been donated to us, plus the leftover stuffing, potatoes, and gravy, which they said they were able to distribute to 11 families.

This year's **Adopt-a-Family fundraiser** is looking to raise \$45,000 for 300 children, \$150 per child (13 and under), who attend schools in the Webutuck and PPCSD school systems.

This year, because of COVID-19, individual gifts will not be distributed. Instead, families will be able to choose gift cards from an array of participating local businesses such as Freshtown, Tractor Supply, Oblong Jr, CVS, Dollar Store and others, where they will be able to redeem their cards to buy clothing, toys, food, and the like. No Amazon or Visa type gift cards will be used. That means all funds raised will support local business and go back into the local economy. The deadline for contributions goes up to and after Christmas.

### December is Cookie Time

We have finally reached the end of 2020! Time to celebrate Christmas season with cookies. This year is obviously different than other years, but some things never change. I admit I'm one of those people who stocked up on flour, sugar and other baking supplies this past summer. Actually, it's nothing that I wouldn't ordinarily do anyway. Sooooooo, hopefully I'm all set to go. I think in previous newsletters I've spoken of my game plan; make a list of cookies to make. Follow up with checking of supplies and compose a shopping list. Each

shopping trip check off as you purchase ingredients. When the time comes you're all set to bake.

As you sort through your to do list, eliminate what doesn't make the final cut and omit it. There are a few. I usually start with 12 plus recipes I would like to make and pare down to 6 or 8. It's a lot of work not to mention the calories! Anyway, time to get that *Mise en place* ready. Thought I'd throw that French term out there. It means getting everything you need for the recipe out and measured and ready to go. I usually divide the list into 2 day's work. I make the dough all up taking 2 days. Then refrigerate and bake within the next few days. Any frosting decorating is left for the end and done in 1 day. Just love those Christmas movies that show it done like magic and in the matter of an hour or so. Those cookies have to be really cooled to frost. Fun thing to do with grandchildren but expect to have extensive clean up duty. Been there, done that but wouldn't change for anything!

I've tried over the years to include a new cookie each year. Some have been successful but most have been one time wonders. No repeat requests, not memorable or on any "keep it list". I had hoped to share several of your favs but had not received any recipes at time of this writing. So you have to put up with a few I'm thinking about making outside my normal, must have and please make and when are you baking list! Got to love those grandchildren!

#### **Ice Box Pecan**

1 c. unsalted butter

1/2 c. sugar

1/4 c. brown sugar

1 1/2 tsp. vanilla

2 1/2 c. flour

1/2 tsp salt

3/4 c. mini semisweet chocolate chips

1/3 c. finely chopped pecans

Cream the butter and both sugars for 5 minutes. Add the vanilla and mix well. Add the dry ingredients and mix until combined. Add the chips and nuts and stir. Put half the dough onto plastic wrap and form into log. Repeat with remaining dough. This will be crumbly and that's fine. Refrigerate at least 2 hours. Can also be made ahead of time and frozen. After chilled slice log into ½ inch pieces and bake in 350 degree oven for 14 minutes. Can use sharp knife or dental floss to slice. If it cracks use fingers to press back together. This is a shortbread cookie which has no eggs.

Yields 2 − 2½ dozen

### **Bulldog Brittle**

½ box graham crackers (about 28 squares)

1 stick butter

1 c. brown sugar

1 tsp vanilla

½ tsp salt

1 c. chopped pecans or nut of choice

Line a cookie sheet with sides with foil (10 x 15)

Cover with the graham crackers. In saucepan melt butter and add the sugar. Bring to boil and boil for 2 minutes. Take off heat and add the vanilla and salt. Pour over top of grahams carefully since this is hot. Sprinkle with the nuts. Bake in 350 degree oven for 12 minutes. Add 2 min. if you want it crunchier. Cool completely and break apart. This is another version of crack that's made with saltines. Saw this on a kids' cooking show. The judges went crazy over it and when they asked the girl who made it, said the recipe came from the old ladies at her church. She asked how old these ladies were and she said 50. Enough said.....

I know I will not be making the dozens of cookies as I've done in the past due to COVID. No giving as gifts etc. But the grandkids look forward to them every year. So I'll be baking them. And on that note will wish all a happy holiday season. Stay safe and we all know it has got to be a better New Year. Until then Happy Cooking....
